PURBECK BREEZER

935 Hop on the Purbeck Breezer 40 at Poole Bus Station stand H. Sit upstairs relax and enjoy the views on your way to Wareham.

Arrive at Wareham – hop off at the Post Office and enjoy a pretty riverside market town. Explore the local shops and cafés (surely it's time for coffee and cake!) and if the sun is shining take a walk down the main road towards The Quay and watch the boats or people paddle boarding on the river. If you're feeling adventurous why not hire a paddleboard or kayak for an hour?

Hop back on the Purbeck Breezer 40 heading towards Corfe Castle and Swanage - Get your cameras ready as the first glimpse of the castle from the top deck is a sight to behold!

34 Get off the bus at Corfe Village centre where you can easily access the castle which is one of Britain's most iconic survivors of the English Civil War – free for National Trust members or an entrance fee is payable at the ticket kiosk.

Corfe Castle is the gateway to the Isle of Purbeck. Whilst you are here, why not check out the traditional sweet shop and buy a treat to enjoy on the rest of your journey.

Hop back on the Purbeck Breezer 40 and continue your journey to Swanage where you will arrive at the Swanage Steam Railway at 1455.

Depending on your personal taste, Swanage has something for everyone! It's a traditional English seaside town provoking those nostalgic memories. Take a ride on a steam train, explore the independent shops, sit on the beach and watch a Punch & Judy show or take a hike over to Durlston Country Park.

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SEASIDE

Before your day out ends, why not treat yourself to meal. Our personal favourite is fish and chips - don't tell anyone but we think the best fish is served at The Fish Plaice!

Hop back on the Purbeck Breezer 40 to begin your journey back to Poole (there are other time options available with the last bus leaving Swanage Monday-Saturday at 2300).
